Brighton Youth Volleyball

The Brighton Youth Volleyball Program is a two-tier skill-building program taught by BHS Boys Varsity Volleyball Coach Eric Gruner and JV Coach Diana Frank. Students in 7th - 12th grade are eligible to register. You do not have to attend Brighton High School to register. This "club style" program extends the season and will benefit high-level youth athletes who desire to improve their skills through training specific to the sport of volleyball. Two group levels are offered - Tier 1 and Tier 2. Please register for the tier you feel most comfortable in. If necessary, the coaches will observe both groups and make changes after talking with the players. All players meet two times a week in the TCMS gyms, Wednesday evenings from 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. The clinic coincides with the USA Volleyball tournament schedule running from Saturday, November 18th through Wednesday, May 18th. Participants may have the opportunity to compete in local USA Volleyball-sanctioned tournaments. Travel to these tournaments will be necessary and will be the responsibility of the parents. Tier 1: High-Performance Level Similar to Varsity level play, knowledge and experience with volleyball skills are required. The fee for Tier 1 is \$850 and includes a team jersey and tournament competition fees. The Class Number is F23S003.

Tier 2: Developmental Performance Level Similar to JV level play, some basic knowledge and experience in volleyball skills are recommended. The fee for Tier 2 is \$650 and includes a team jersey. If a Tier 2 participant competes in a tournament, an additional fee to cover entry to the tournament is required. The Class Number is F23S004.

NYS Driver Education

Driver & Traffic Safety Education in New York State is a program implemented via a partnership between the New York State Education Department (NYSED) and the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). The Driver Education course intends to educate current high school students (ages 16+) about appropriate driving skills, habits, and a responsible role in the highway transportation/safety system. Course highlights include classroom instruction and behind-the-wheel training and observation. Students receive the MV-285: Student Certification of Completion. You must already have your Learner's Permit to take this class. This program is offered at BHS through a contract with Monroe One BOCES four times a year -- fall, winter, spring, and summer. Dates and basic information about each session are located at www.bcsd.org/Domain/266. Future session dates are available as soon as BOCES confirms them.

The Fall session begins on September 19th. Registration opens on Tuesday, September 12th at 8:00 p.m.: brightonschools.revtrak.net.

The winter session begins the first week of January, with registration opening the first week of December. The fee for this course is \$610 which includes a 3.5% administrative service charge for credit card transactions.

Brighton Preschool/Parent Program



The Brighton Preschool/Parent Program has been an educational resource in our community for over 60 years! It allows children to share and learn in a safe and nurturing environment where children are valued and accepted as unique. The work of preschoolers is play! Our curriculum provides creative opportunities for all children to encourage social development and independence building. Planned activities and teacher interaction foster early education skill-building. Through play, our students discover what they enjoy most and what makes them feel competent. Our preschool is a place where children learn what it means to be a good friend. We provide diverse opportunities for experimentation, which challenge thinking and reasoning abilities. Our facilities are perfect for large and small motor development - inside the classroom and outside on the playground. One of the most significant features of our preschool is the amount of parental involvement. On a rotating basis, a parent (or another family member/nanny) serves as a volunteer helper in the classroom. Each family is responsible for volunteering six times a year. This commitment to being a part of the classroom gives families a strong foundation for creating positive home-to-school connections.

The preschool is located on the first floor of the Brighton Central School District's Central Administration Building, 2035 Monroe Avenue, Rochester, NY 14618. The program follows the Brighton Central School District calendar and is closed when the school district is closed for holidays, recess periods, and emergency school closings. The preschool year begins on Monday, September 18, 2023, and ends on Thursday, May 30, 2024. It is open to children three or four years old by December 1, 2023. Three and four-year-old students are in the same class. Thirty-two students are enrolled each year - sixteen in a class that meets from 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. and a different group of sixteen in a class that meets from 12:30 - 3:00 p.m. A family requests that their child be placed in preschool either two, three, or four days a week. A class from 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. meets on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Another class meets from 12:30 - 3:00 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. No classes meet on Thursday afternoons or Fridays. Registration for the upcoming school year begins in January. Once a class has enrolled the maximum number of students allowed, prospective families can be added to a waitlist. More detailed information is available at bcsd.org/preschool.
