Brighton-Rennes Exchange	Jessica Beh	A school-to-to school exchange with Lycée Sévigné, in Rennes, France that takes place every two years. French students visit in October/November, and BHS students travel in March/April of the same school year. Hosting is open to all BHS students. Travel is open to students in good academic standing who have hosted or are enrolled in a French or science class. Our visit to France includes 2-3 days in Paris with a trip to Versailles on our way to Rennes. In Rennes, students stay with their host family for a week, attend school, visit Normandy beaches, WWII museum, Mont Saint-Michel, and the city of Rennes.
