Topic Sentence: Garden of Eden allusion

suggests that innocence is lost as time goes by

Evidence: "So Eden sank to grief" (6)

Explanation: Literal = The Garden of Eden is a Biblical paradise.

Figurative = Eden represents a place of perfection and

innocence, and in this way, it represents youthful innocence. Eden

"sank" into "grief" once difficulties were introduced, just as

innocence learns to "grieve," or recognize sadness, as youth fades. **Connection** = This means that innocence is lost as time goes by.
